Please see below a few important reminders:

We continue to have parking issues on Cunningham, Broom, Doyle. This is a serious safety issue, so. the Board has instructed Management to start putting stickers on vehicles that violate the parking rules. Please be sure to inform any guests of the parking rules prior to entering the community. Management will not respond to complaints regarding stickered vehicles.

Parking is not allowed in front of homes where there are "No Parking This Side of The Street "signs. Parking in the street is permitted on one side of the street on all streets in the Del Webb Community.

Owners are responsible for guests illegally parking in the streets. Please be sure to remind guests to obey the "NO PARKING" signs.

Also, given the increase in Electric Vehicles in the community, the board has opened a second EV parking space at the clubhouse. No other vehicles are permitted to park in the open EV parking spaces at any time. These spaces are only for Electric Vehicle charging. Any vehicle parked in an open EV spot that is not charging their vehicle will get a t sticker on the vehicle. Open spaces can be identified by the signage.

- This is a reminder that ANY exterior modification requires approval from the ARC Committee.
 - The implementation of rules, regulations, and controls on the architectural and aesthetic elements of any residential development is a proven way to manage the overall visual character of a community while helping to protect an owner's individual property value. Therefore, any work that affects the external appearance of a unit, the lot, or landscaping, *requires prior approval from Del Webb at Florham Park. ARC Committee.*

The History and Significance of Passover

Passover, or Pesach, is one of the most significant Jewish holidays, commemorating the Israelites' liberation from slavery in Egypt over 3,000 years ago. The story is primarily told in the Book of Exodus, where Moses, under divine guidance, led the Israelites to freedom after enduring harsh oppression under Pharaoh's rule.

The name "Passover" originates from the final and most devastating of the Ten Plagues sent upon Egypt—the death of the firstborn. According to the biblical narrative, God instructed the Israelites to mark their doorposts with the blood of a lamb so that the Angel of Death would "pass over" their homes, sparing their children. This event ultimately pressured Pharaoh to release the Israelites, allowing them to begin their journey to the Promised Land.

Passover is celebrated for seven or eight days (depending on tradition) with rituals that emphasize remembrance and gratitude. The most central tradition is the Seder, a ceremonial meal where families read from the Haggadah, eat symbolic foods like matzah (unleavened bread), and retell the Exodus story. The absence of leavened bread symbolizes the Israelites' hasty departure from Egypt, leaving no time for dough to rise.

Passover remains a powerful reminder of freedom, faith, and resilience, connecting generations through its rich traditions and profound historical significance.

In Old English May is called the "month of three milkings": referring to a time when the cows could be milked three times a day.


The History and Significance of Easter








PROJECT SHRUB

Great News - Spring Has Sprung!

Fingers crossed, it's time to put away the winter boots. Fingers crossed again, it's time to wiggle into last year's bathing suit for size! If that goes well, let's move on to a short list of Spring Safety tips to ensure an easy transition from snow showers to rain showers.

FEMA urges families to keep one handy consisting of water, food, flashlight, and batteries, first aid kit, filter mask, and medicines. Visit the FEMA website for a complete list and advice on devising a Family Emergency Plan and stocking your Emergency Kit.

Vehicles Need Spring Love Too – after a long winter, check windshield wipers, tire pressure and tread, headlights, taillights, brake lights, and fluid levels. Your car will thank you!

Protect Yourself from the Warming Sun – Always wear sunscreen, even on cloudy days. Hats with brims, and sunglasses further protect our bodies from potentially harmful rays.


